

## News from the Seminary Board

The Theological Seminary board met in the first quarter of 2005 twice – first at a special, and then a regular board meeting. The special meeting was summoned on Feb. 8 after former president RUDOLPH BLÜMCKE resigned. On behalf of the board Archbishop GEORG KRETSCHMAR nominated seminary teacher Rev. GODEKE VON BREMEN to be the new president. It is planned that Rev. GODEKE VON BREMEN will work as the president of the Theological Seminary until 2007.

They discussed the graduation examination rules in detail because these examinations are not mere exams in the end of studies, but they also embrace the internship time and the final colloquium.
